

# Battle of Badr

The Battle of Badr (Arabic: غزوة بدر), fought on Tuesday, 13 March 624 CE (17 Ramadan, 2 AH in the Islamic calendar) in the Hejaz region of western Arabia (present-day Saudi Arabia), was a key battle in the early days of Islam and a turning point in Muhammad's (PBUH) struggle with his opponents among the Quraish in Mecca.

Prior to the battle, the Muslims and the Meccans had fought several smaller skirmishes in late 623 and early 624. Badr, however, was the first large-scale engagement between the two forces. Advancing to a strong defensive position, Muhammad's (PBUH) well-disciplined force broke the Meccan lines, killing several important Quraishi leaders including the Muslims' chief antagonist Abu Jahl.

We MUST remember Struggles of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) who was directly involved in 28 Battles while delegated 73 Battles to Sahabas after migration to Madinah during the period of 10 years.
